Firstly the members generosity never ceases to amaze me. You continue to give week in and week out through the various activities that are either organised or through donations. I feel it is important to give an update on where the charity stands currently.

A few years ago we went away from the idea of having one charity to support and instead created a charitable fund that would be able to help numerous good causes. Currently we are holding a fund of circa 56k in the bank. However 36k has been allocated towards one of Ingrid's charities which has not yet been paid.

To date I have given to two very good causes. Association MVC in Caldas de Rainha. They were looking for help for 60 children who rely on their soup kitchen. The need was for school books for the start of the new year. We were delighted to donate the sum of 1200 euro for a wonderful cause.

The second Organization we are currently supporting is Oeste International Community Volunteers. Many of you will know this organization as it is run by Joseph Poon who is a regular bridge player. Joseph and his team are involved in visiting and cooking for Old Folks organizations along the Silver Coast. They introduce them to various different foods but mainly Chinese. They have managed to do this by transporting their equipment in their cars. They were looking for help to buy a trailer and we were more than happy to help a great cause and we donated the 6000 euro required. The trailer should arrive later this month and we will do a handover in January when I am sure Joseph will give you a lot more information on his organization.

We are constantly looking for other charities or causes to help and with this in mind if anyone has any ideas please do not hesitate to contact me and I will be happy to discuss.

We are all aware of the challenges with getting tee times during the busy periods and I have referred to this earlier on in my newsletter.

Dave Moxham, Geoff Newton and my self met with Francisco to discuss our concerns on behalf of the members recently. It was a very frank discussion and we put our views across and gave member feedback.

Obviously the one tee start did impact availability this year and we will be reverting to the two tee start in January, however during December, if the situation allows ,we maybe able to get two tee starts on occasions. We pointed out that more members are now living here and also more retiring so the need for members times needs to be increased. Francisco understands this and he is givingus an increase for competitions next year. Also the two tee start will also allow extra tee times daily. We are currently working on the Calendar for the 23/24 season and we are factoring this extra availability in.

Just to remind you, we have over 250 competitions a year and generally we can accommodate everyone. Can I please remind you of the importance of booking non competition tee times well in advance during the busy periods, ie. October/November and March/April. Although we are all members, we are not a private members club, so there is a limit on what we can expect.
